The recorded number of marine passengers for this quarter was 12,324.

A decrease of 30% was experienced for this quarter when compared to last quarter. A reason for this was the Covid-19 travel restrictions which included a lockdown of Tarawa in May 2021.

For this quarter, Abaiang was the top most visited island with 2626 while the 6 least visited islands of Kuria, Tab North, Tab South, Nikunau, Tamana and Arorae had zero marine passengers.

For the Line & Phoenix islands, there was no recorded data for this quarter.

Note - maritime data is only based on vessels departing Betio and Bairiki ports only. Smaller vessels departing from other locations on South Tarawa are not included.

Air travel (Bonriki airport only)

The total number of air passengers travelling to outer islands was 2509 with Abemama being the most visited island with 275, while Abaiang was the least visited with 66 passengers.

Given Abaiang is one of the closest islands to Tarawa, it is cheaper to travel to the island on boat therefore less air passengers.

An increase of 53.5% was experienced for this quarter when compared to last quarter's data. Q2 saw less disruptions in domestic flights and an additional aircraft bringing the fleet to two. This extra plane led to more flights to all Gilbert islands.

Note - air transport data is based only on flights out of Bonriki International Airport. Kiritimati domestic flights were suspended in Q4 2020.



Supply



A total number of 45 accommodations spread across 15 islands are currently operating in Kiribati. 6 have closed down.

428 rooms and 744 beds are available from these 45 accommodations providing employment to 229 staff which is a 2% increase in the number of employees compared to Q1 2021. This increase is a result of a new accommodation on Marakei and the inclusion of Arorae in our database.
